## **Track Description:**

The BAM Special Interest Group on Inter-Organizational Collaboration: Partnerships, Alliances and Networks (SIGIOC) organises a dynamic and inter-disciplinary track that aims to break the still existing silos in the field of inter-organizational relations. The track brings together researchers with diverse focal topics and theoretical foundations, who share an interest in collaboration across organizational boundaries.

For the track, we consider papers dealing with any form of inter-organizational collaboration. This means papers can deal with both formalised and informal collaborative arrangements among or across public, private and third sector organizations. They can focus on inter-organizational collaborations on different levels from individual, team to organizational level, and even meta-organizational level. They can focus on local, regional, national or international/global collaborations in or across various field or industry. We thus welcome a wide variety of approaches in empirical, conceptual or theoretical pieces. We also welcome papers discussing methodological issues particular to inter-organizational collaborations research.

While we accept a wide range of papers, in line with the conference theme this year, we particularly welcome contributions, which explore the question of how collaboration can support the COVID19 recovery, and what we can learn from the experiences of collaboration during the COVID19 pandemic.

Building on the excellent sessions of the IOC-track at recent BAM conferences, we are especially keen to receive developmental papers to stimulate discussion. Suggestions for Symposia that integrate aspects of inter-organizational contexts are also welcome.
