For BAM2024, we are particularly interested in contributions examining the inclusive role of digital advancements, including machine learning (ML), artificial intelligence (AI), blockchain technologies, and financial technology and innovation within the context of digital and green transformation. Contributions on the interfaces of the digital transformation agenda and green financial policy as well as corporate governance are particularly welcome. We also welcome theoretical and empirical work on green finance, carbon accounting and green credentials, as well as any work tapping on behavioural and institutional interpretations of firm decisions. Finally, studies on the increasing role of private equity and venture capitals in financial markets, especially within the context of corporate social responsibility and performance, are warmly invited.
