Track Description:

The theme of this year's BAM conference has clear implications for the DMUU track given the ways in which decisions can generate outcomes that are positive or negative and do so across different or organisational constituencies. The ways in which we 'reimagine' decisions and their associated outcomes have been evident across a range of issues including BREXIT and the responses to the COVID19 pandemic.

The Decision-Making Under Uncertainty (DMUU) track encourages the submission of papers addressing the challenges that organisations face under such conditions. For 2022, the track has a focus on the potential that decisions have for good and bad outcomes to have the same genesis, the role of intervening variables in the shaping of decision outcomes, and the ways in which uncertainty is managed across borders - whether they be geo-political, cultural, intellectual, or organisational – and the ways in which those borders can generate good or bad outcomes. The track emphasises the inter-disciplinary and multi-level nature of the decision-making process within and across organisations and over different timescales. Papers will also be considered outside of these themes and the track will continue to support papers that deal with the issues of risk and crisis management within organisations.
